After weeks of continued bombings in their Damascus neighborhood, the Syrian <b>refugee</b> family fled civil war in the hope of reaching safety in Turkey.		
The LGBT youth who fled his home in Shiraz, Iran, after his father reported him to Iranian police sought <b>asylum</b> upon arrival in Serbia because he feared persecution if he returned home.		
In 2016, the immigrant population in the United States was 43.7 million, or about 13.5% of the total population. Three-quarters of the <b>immigrants</b> are in the United States legally. <sup>2</sup>		
Barely able to afford food for her two children, the <b>migrant</b> mother from Honduras made the difficult decision to leave her children with relatives and make the dangerous journey to the United States in the hope of making money to send home to her family.
